Brian died suddenly on Wednesday 26th at his home in Sale, Cheshire, from a heart attack

Brian Smith, in his prime, was a middle of The Club hockey player, a 10 Handicap golfer, and could tell you the value of your crib hand before you had laid it down. He joined Blackheath as a schoolboy; captained the Extra 3rds; and could mend clocks and watches. He was a regular in The Outcasts - except once, after a particularly heavy Saturday night, when Brian failed to appear the following Sunday and we played one short. On investigation it transpired that Brian had slept through the entire Sunday and not woken until the Monday morning. Many Outcast tourists who retired to bed before midnight would find themselves being woken in the early hours to find Brian brushing their teeth.

While guesting for Hampton-in-Arden on a trip to Guernsey he was given a clergyman's dog-collar by the tour organiser — The Reverend Joe Evans — which Brian wore subsequently on all Outcast tours to the extent that many of the teams we played were convinced he was in holy orders. He took confessions at the Worthing Festival and while wearing it on one trip to Maidenhead we stopped off to buy the Sunday Papers, whereupon Brian, pointing to the magazines on the top shelf, said to the newsagent " I don't think you should be displaying those on the Sabbath............. the're ****ing disgusting"

He joined Blackheath while still at school and well remembered being "looked after" by the older members, John Webber and Brian Fransella who gave him lifts to matches and propped him against his front door when they delivered him home in the evening. When I first knew Brian, he lived just off Bromley High Street and on Saturday mornings there was great competition between my wife and Jean Robertson to see who could park in his driveway first for the weekly visit to Safeways.

As a hockey player Brian was in the "vigorous" class; his tackling was of the stick breaking variety and were he playing under today's conditions he would have attracted a large number of yellow cards. However, we were then playing on grass, before cards and disciplinary procedures were necessary and when umpires knew their place. As long as Brian tackled in the general area of the ball he was satisfied – although our opponents were not universally happy with having their sticks knocked out of their hands, but Brian would apologise cheerily and blame it on his shocking eyesight. This took a toll on his own equipment and he got through two or three sticks every season.

Brian was always one of the last to bed "we'll just have one for the road!" was a regularly heard comment and generally it wasn't only one! "Young Flynn – you're not going to lead me astray again are you? Shall we just have one for the road?" It is a fitting epitaph. However, Brian took a very responsible view of drink driving; coming back from one away game he dropped his car off at his house and took the bus to the Club so that he could have a few drinks. The problem was that he forgot he had left his car at home and spent the evening on soft drinks, even refusing several offers of a lift home as he "had his car".

I have been on hockey tours, golf tours and sailing holidays with Brian and he was always the same cheerful giving person, who brightened every event. On one occasion he was especially pleased to be invited on a sailing weekend by lan Robertson, but not quite so delighted to discover that this involved us spending most of the first day lying underneath the boat scraping its bottom. He was even less pleased when we came out of the pub that evening to find that the tide had gone out, and there wasn't enough water to float the dinghy. He had to wade through foot deep mud to get back on board.

He was a genial soul, generous of his time and his affection, and in Jacqueline Maltman he found the perfect soul-mate and they married in 1978. Brian worked for The Royal Artillery R & D Establishment and was based at Sevenoaks until 1979 when his job moved to Cheshire. Brian and Jacqueline moved to Sale; produced Elizabeth, Allison and Alistair; and he joined the Bowls Club. Sale is very conveniently placed about half way between London and Glasgow and the Bartlett Family have regularly enjoyed their hospitality on our journeys north.

Brian has maintained a close contact with the Club through the years, he was one of the seven Members who attended both the Centenary and 150th Dinners. You don't meet many people like Brian in life and we are all the poorer for it - we will miss his humour, and his companionship.
